



## SPRING RESIDENTIAL CLEAN-UP PROGRAM

The 2010 Spring Residential Clean-Up Program is being held **Friday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>** and **Saturday, April 24<sup>th</sup>**. This program is **for citizens of Colwood only** and confirmation of residency will be required. The drop off area will be open on each of the above noted dates from 8:30a.m. to 4:00p.m. Residents may drop off their material at the Public Works Yard, 3300 Wishart Road. **Pre-sorting your load will assist in a quicker unloading process for recycling and help keep costs to a minimum.**

Please be advised that household garbage is not to be dropped off as part of the Spring Residential Clean-Up Program. The collection of household garbage is the responsibility of the householder and services can be provided by private companies or by dropping off your garbage at an approved landfill site.

Drop off fees are as follows:

Car/minimum charge	\$15.00
*Small Pickup Truck	\$20.00
*Standard Pickup Truck	\$25.00
Trailer, 2.5 metres/8 feet	\$25.00
Oversized loads will be charged per estimated cubic metre.	\$30.00
<b>Vehicles weighing more than 2 tons not permitted</b>	

**\*Note: A truck load is based on the vehicle being loaded to the top of the standard box height.**

Materials which **MAY BE** dropped off:

Appliances, batteries, automotive parts, barrels, bathtubs, bikes, branches with trunks no greater than 100mm (4") in diameter, bricks, cardboard, carpet, clothing, compost, concrete blocks, fridges, freezers, furniture, glass, grass clippings, hot water tanks, lumber, rims, rocks, sinks, sports equipment, stoves, derimmed tires, toilets, underlay, wire cut into 1 meter lengths, wood waste.

**Residents dropping off branches during the Spring Residential Clean-Up Program will be charged to dispose of the branches.** Please call your Public Works Office for information on the free City of Colwood Branch Drop Off Program.

Materials which **MAY NOT** be dropped off:

Drywall, gypsum board, tree stumps, tires attached to rims, paint, toxic household hazardous wastes and propane tanks.
